Project Funding

- \$ The estimated cost of this project exceeds \$2 million, of which the City of Burton's share will be approximately \$500,000.
- \$ This project has been included in the 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program.
- \$ This project will receive Federal Surface Transportation Program (STPU) funds.
- \$ It had been scheduled for 2020 construction, but the City obtained a low interest State Infrastructure Bank loan to "Advance Construct" it a year earlier, and repay the loan with already-approved federal funding.
- \$ Doing so will save about \$50,000 in pothole patching maintenance costs.

Project Overview

The project will consist of approximately 5200 ft. of bituminous and concrete pavement rehabilitation on Center Road from Davison Road north to the City limit at Dolphaine Street. Project includes:

- o Complete removal of center lane and inside SB lane asphalt and concrete/soil cement
- o Asphalt base and joint repair as required.
- o 3½" asphalt resurfacing in two lifts - all lanes.
- o Drainage improvements.
- o Miscellaneous concrete curb and gutter work.
- o Concrete sidewalk, ramp and approach repair and replacement.
- o Replacement of signs and pavement markings.

The project is scheduled to be completed in October.

All work is weather-dependent!

Staging

Construction began July 12th.

Stage I: Full roadway reconstruction in southbound and center turn lanes; intermittent curb and gutter repair, driveway replacements, joint repairs, and milling and HMA resurfacing; access to drives to be maintained utilizing maintenance gravel as needed.

Stage II: Construction in the two northbound lanes. Two way traffic will be shifted onto new leveling course of southbound; intermittent curb and gutter repairs, driveway replacements, pavement joint repairs, and milling and resurfacing through the wearing (top) course.

Stage III: Traffic moved back into the Stage I configuration for the placement of wearing (top) course of southbound lanes.

Note: The road will remain open and access to all driveways will be maintained at all times throughout the project. However, motorists are advised to expect traffic delays!

Nothing is allowed to be installed in road rights-of-way without a permit from the City of Burton, including such things as signage, fencing, vegetation and lawn sprinklers. Neither the City nor its contractors assumes any liability for damage of anything placed in the right-of-way by property owners. Therefore, property owners are advised to remove anything they have placed in the right-of-way, prior to the start of the project.

City to Begin the Restoration of Center Road from Davison Road to Dolphaine Street Burton, Michigan. ---

Mayor Paula Zelenko is pleased to announce that the City of Burton has begun the rehabilitation of Center Road from Davison Road to the City Limit at Dolphaine Street.

The project will consist of approximately one mile of bituminous and concrete pavement rehabilitation, and will include: HMA (hot mix asphalt) cold milling; removal of center lane and inside SB lane asphalt and concrete/soil cement; 3½-inch HMA resurfacing; drainage improvements; miscellaneous concrete curb and gutter repair; concrete sidewalk and ramp repair and replacement as needed; traffic signal upgrades; new pavement markings; ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) ramps upgrade; and final restoration.

Use of a part-width construction process, delineated by cones and signage, will enable 2-way traffic and access to properties to be maintained at all times. However, motorists are advised to expect traffic delays, and are asked to exercise caution.

The project is scheduled to be complete in October. No work will be performed during holidays. All work is weather-dependent.
