Synopsis of work done

Here we will describe the work that has been accomplished to date, focusing on work done in the previous week or so. For this first issue, here is an overview of the funding that has been procured to construct this project:

- ✓ This project has been included in the 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program.
- ✓ This project will receive Federal Surface Transportation Program (STPU) Funds.
- ✓ The estimated cost of this project is \$1,168,000 of which the City of Burton's share will be approximately \$234,000.
- ✓ The project is scheduled to begin June 11th and completed by this fall.

What to expect next

Here we will describe the work that is planned and expected to be done in the coming week or so. For this first issue, here is an overview of the entire project:

The project will cover Center Road between Lippincott Boulevard to Lapeer Road including:

- hot mix asphalt milling and resurfacing
- drainage improvement and upgrade
- pavement repair and undercutting
- miscellaneous concrete curb and gutter work
- concrete sidewalk and ADA ramp repair and replacement
- pedestrian signal installation
- permanent pavement marking

The project is scheduled to be completed in the fall of 2018.

All work is dependent on weather!

To Save You Money!

The contractor will soon be installing stakes to mark the boundary between the road right of way and private property.

Please review these stakes! **Anything on the road side of the stakes will be removed when construction begins in that area.** This includes sprinkler heads, decorative items, etc. You might want to cut, cap and save your sprinkler heads for reinstallation outside the right of way when the project is complete. **This is the property owner's responsibility!**

Note: Center Road will remain open and driveway access to businesses will be maintained at all times during the project!

City to begin rehabilitation of Center Road between Lippincott Boulevard and Lapeer Road

Burton, Michigan. ---

Mayor Paula Zelenko is pleased to announce that the City of Burton is scheduled to begin the rehabilitation of Center Road between Lippincott Boulevard and Lapeer Road on Monday, June 11, 2018.

The project includes hot mix asphalt milling and resurfacing work, drainage improvement, pavement repair, miscellaneous concrete curb and gutter work, concrete sidewalk and ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) ramp repair and replacement, pedestrian signal installation work, replacement of permanent signing and pavement markings, and final restoration.

Use of part-width construction process, delineated by cones and signage, will enable traffic to be maintained throughout the project. Access to properties maintained at all times. However, motorists are advised to expect traffic delays throughout the duration of the project.

The project is scheduled to be completed in the fall of 2018. No work will be performed during the Independence Day holiday.
